## **FIRA General Meeting**

February 9, 2020

# **Approval** of last meeting minutes:

~ A motion to accept the September 2019 Annual General Meeting Minutes was made by Dianne Kelly, seconded by MaryAnn Hodgins and carried.

#### Financial update (Joe DiFrancesco):

~ Dues collected were \$6,800 and fundraisers netted \$6,725. Fitness, which is not a fundraiser, ended up \$230 over with December receipts deposited in January. Operating expenses were \$6,626 and were covered by dues so fundraising could be put toward major improvements of the deck and a new door costing \$3,500, with the remainder increasing our bank balance to \$11,518 at year end. We also still have two GIC's totaling \$18,658 so financial condition is sound.

#### **Previous business updates**

- ~ **Property Sale:** We have obtained all the information we needed from the Municipality. We are now waiting on confirmation from a Minden lawyer to see if he'll take our case as we need legal opinion on our obligations if we should purchase property. After we obtain all our facts, a pros and cons list will be created, distributed and we will vote on the decision to purchase the property.
- ~ **Trillium Grant:** Unfortunately, we were again unsuccessful in obtaining this grant. We are looking into new grants that may be available. Bill & Irene Odell have been researching the types of grants that other adult community centres and senior active living centres receive. It doesn't look like Dysart is doing anything to support the seniors in the town of Haliburton at this time with any type of social center. Smaller communities than ours receive funding for senior activities and community centers. Bill & Irene will continue to obtain information.
- ~ **Door Installation:** We do have the door and it's ready and are working on getting a contractor for spring. Dan Kay is going to look at the door and it's hardware and give us a price.

#### **New Business**

~ **Board Members:** We need to vote in our 2 new additions to the board for 2020. Bill Odell was going to be our 2nd Member-at-Large but has agreed to take the Vice President position and Lynn Yake is willing to be the new Member-at-Large. Glen Smith motioned for both Bill & Lynn to assume these positions with a second by Lynda Newton and the motion was approved.
